Part 1

Child: There are two boys behind her. Which one do you mean?
Adult: The older one. He's wearing a purple T-shirt.
Child: That's David. He's good at all sports.
Adult: Oh look! That's very dangerous! Look at that boy!
Child: Which boy? What's he doing?
Adult: Can you see him climbing? The boy in the blue and white striped shorts.
Child: Oh yes! That's Harry. He's very brave.
Adult: Yes, but he should be very careful. Climbing is a very dangerous hobby.
Child: Yes, I will tell him.
Adult: What's that boy doing?
Child: Which one?
Adult: The one with the white shorts with red spots.

- Child: Oh, you mean Nick. I'm not sure what he's doing. Maybe he's going to paint something.
Adult: Oh, I would like to see it when he finishes.
Child: Me too. Nick is very good at painting.
Adult: What's the matter with that little girl?
Child: Which one?
Adult: That one in the orange T-shirt?
Child: That's Lucy.
Adult: Why is she crying?
Child: The ball has just hit her castle. Oh dear!
Adult: She can make it again. Maybe you should go and help her.
Child: Yes, I think you're right.
