The boys help the woman carry the bags. The woman gives the boys cake for helping her. (What's the woman carrying? Are the bags easy to carry? What do the boys do? etc.)

- E: (Point to the first set of four pictures) Now look at these four pictures. One is different. (Point to the second, third and fourth sets in turn) The water is different. Cake, a hamburger and a sandwich are food. You eat them. You don't eat water. You drink it.
 - Now you tell me about these pictures. Which one is different? Why?
- **C:** (Candidate suggests a difference any plausible difference is acceptable)

 (What are these? (birds) And this? (an animal) etc.)

Personal questions

- **E:** Now let's talk about your family. How many brothers and sisters have you got?
- **C:** (Two.) (Do you have two brothers or sisters? Three?)
- **E:** Who cooks dinner in your family?
- **C:** (My mum and dad.) (Does your mum cook dinner? And your dad?)
- **E:** Where do you and your family watch TV?
- **C:** (In the living room and the kitchen.) (Do you watch TV in the living room?)
- **E:** Tell me about what you do with your family at the weekend.

(What do the girl and her dad see? Where is the ball? How does the boy feel? What does the girl do? etc.)
